

Your Health

From the desk of our Parish Nurse

Vaping The New Crave.

E-cigarettes or vape pens have been around for more than a decade. The vape pen has boomed in popularity recently because of marketing to nicotine users looking for a safer alternative to smoking cigarettes. A Vape pen creates an inhalable vapor with a small inner coil that slowly heats and creates a vapor that is inhaled.

If you think your vaping habit is harmless, think again. In 2016 more than 2 million middle and high school students used an E-cigarette or vape pen each month. There is a perception that E-cigarettes are harmless, and vaping is less harmful than smoking regular cigarettes, these products don't come without risks. Because they are fairly new the health care world is still learning about long term effects, but some science is clear. Here are four risks worth noting.

Most E-cigarettes contain nicotine, same drug found in regular cigarettes. Nicotine has known damaging effects. It is addictive, it is toxic to fetuses and it can harm brain tissue in developing children up to age 20.

E-Cigarette aerosol can harm the body. The substances that vapor users breathe in and exhale can contain harmful substances like nicotine, chemicals and heavy metals. Because the products aren't regulated, it is impossible to know what's in a vapor or E-Cigarette.

Dr. Pushan Jani, a pulmonologist at Memorial Hermann Texas Medical Center explains. When your lungs sense something is not quite right is going on our immune system rushes to attack. "Common sense

would tell you that vaping leads to inflammation within the lungs. It comes down to how our bodies process and react to the foreign substance.

E-Cigarettes can cause injuries. It doesn't happen very often but the batteries have malfunctioned causing burns to hands and face. Also, children and adults have been poisoned by swallowing or breathing the liquid in a vapor pen or E-cigarette.

Flavoring can target the very young. E-Cigarette usage has been increasing among teens over the last 5 years. The flavoring has an appeal. In 2016 findings that kids perceive the fruit flavor E-cigarette to be less harmful. Part of the Tobacco industry's purpose of the fun flavors is to draw the young people in.

The latest auestion is. does Vaping cause popcorn Lung. Popcorn lung is caused by inhalation of diacetyl fumes which cause scarring



to lung tissue. Will vaping popcorn flavored liquid lead to young adults scarring their lungs for life causing many health issues?



Music Notes From the Director of Music

Joy to the World: a Christmas Carol?

Joy to the World is one of the most well-known songs of the Christmas season, yet it is not really about Christmas at all. Written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), it is a song about the second coming of Christ rather than the first.

Isaac Watts was born in South Hampton, England. The son of a dissenting pastor, he exhibited a gift for rhyme early on and wrote his first hymn at age fifteen. Isaac went on to become a pastor and served a large independent church in London. He also continued to be a prolific hymn writer, writing some 750 hymns during his lifetime. In 1719 he published a hymn book titled *The* Psalms of David: Imitated in the Language of the New Testament and Applied to the Christian State and Worship. In this collection, he rewrote the Psalms to reveal their New Testament meaning and included specific references to Christ and his ministry. It is in this collection that we find the rewriting of Psalm 98 that we know as the hymn Joy to the World.

Often, the first line of the hymn is mistakenly sung: "Joy to the world! The Lord has come." What Watts wrote was actually: "The Lord is come!" Like Psalm 98, Watts is referring to the second coming of Christ, not the first. This is evident in phrases like "...the Savior reigns" and "He rules the world with truth and grace."

Antioch, the tune to which Joy to the World is sung, was created by an unknown individual who pieced together musical themes from the oratorio Messiah, by George Frederick Handel (1685-1759). Such borrowing of musical ideas was common in those days and there is no autographed score by Handel indicating that he composed the actual tune itself. American music educator Lowell Mason (1792-1872), who had considerable influence in his day, published Joy to the World in 1836 in the U.S. and gave the tune Antioch its name.

Share the good news of Jesus' birth with this creative Christmas card.

What you need:

- Construction paper (two pieces, including one white)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens
- Glue stick

What you do:

- 1. Neatly fold the white paper in half, short side to short side.
- 2. Draw two parallel lines (at least 2 inches apart) from the fold to about halfway to the edge. Cut along the lines.
- 3. Fold the cut section back and forth so it pops up.
- 4. Push the section up so it pops up inside the folded paper. Draw a nativity scene on the pop-up box.
- 5. Fold the colored paper in half, short side to short side. Place the white paper inside it and glue the white paper down, being careful not to glue the pop-up box.
- 6. Write a Christmas message and give or send the card to someone.
