#### From Pastor John Stennes-Spidahl

I had the joy and privilege of attending the annual assembly of the La Crosse Area Synod in June. It was the 23rd time. I haven't missed one since I was assigned to the synod as a seminary senior. They are always uplifting and motivating. The word "synod" only occurs one time in the New Testament. It is found in Luke 2:44, the story of Jesus as a boy at the temple: "Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a day's journey. Then they began to look for him among their relatives and friends." Here synod is translated as group of travelers. So, as a synod we are traveling companions in the way of our Master, Jesus the Christ. Together we do God's work and make Christ's love known.

Synod Assembly involves great worship, reports from the bishop, the bishop's assistant, a representative from the ELCA, and various ministries. Workshops help us learn new things. We also conduct the business of the synod such as establishing the budget and agreeing on resolutions which express the will of the gathered believers. Four resolutions were passed this year. 1) To protect the rights of Palestinian children living under Israeli military occupation. 2) Feed My Sheep – every congregation should designate at least one World Hunger Sunday each year. 3) Regarding the Farm Bill – to encourage support of a farm bill that curbs hunger, supports

agricultural economies in rural communities, and promotes the sustainable use of natural resources. 4) Regarding the separation of immigrant children from their parents. More details are available on the synod's website www.lacrosseareasynod.org.

Finally, a definite highlight for me was meeting and getting to know three visitors from our new Companion Synod – the Evangelical Church of the Czech Brethren. It is such a joy to know that we are traveling together and serving Christ together with wonderful believers from around the world.



## Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurse

Dear Congregation,

Letters from Church Camp.

The last week of July I went on another mission trip. I spent a week at Pine Lake United Methodist Church camp. I arrived with the role of camp nurse. The group I spent time with were from my hometown church of Platteville, WI. I joined my brother, niece and some old familiar faces from my childhood years as a camper. After the first few hours and a familiarity game I started to connect names to faces to 30 kids. While experiencing a childhood summer past time of church camp, I will share with you a few empowering moments.

#### Diversity:

Today I was inspired by our campers. Thirty kids of all ages from Platteville intermingling with another camp group. The other group members were adults with special needs of all ages. I was informed that the kids from Platteville have been attending camp the same week with this adult group for years. Tonight it was a craft night both groups in the mess hall making their banners and making a painted cross project. A woman approached me from the other camp group, her name was Val. With no fear she came right up to me said Hi and asked "what is your name?" So like my experience with the people in Yetebon, Ethiopia. Again groups so different from each other, but here worshiping, joining in fellowship and enjoying the week. If only the world could mingle the same way.

#### Monday Letter:

Theme today the story of Rebekah and Jacob. Genesis 27:1-45 and 33:1-17. God forgives all people, even in the midst of sin and broken relationships. Forgiveness today and every day. The kids are reminded that everyone sins and that is because we are human but to remember God forgives us from all our sins. He sent Jesus to be our savior. Sometimes the hardest person to forgive is to forgive oneself.

#### Tuesday Letter:

Theme today the story of David and Bathsheba. 2 Samuel 11:1-27 and 2 Samuel 12:1-15. How can imperfect people be made new? This begins by knowing God forgives us all. We all make mistakes at times in our lives. Forgiveness begins when we forgive each other because again God forgives us of all our sins. Today I reminded children when there were mini disagreements and feelings are hurt that saying sorry is the first step to mending feelings. Children are much more accepting of the phrase "I'm sorry." Adults could take lessons from the children and forgive each other, move on and love one another the way God would like us to live.

#### Wednesday's letter:

Theme today is the story of Jonah. Jonah 1:1-17 and 3:1-5 and 4:1-11. We focused on the question who is worthy of God's salvation. Kids were taught thru the Bible story that not one person is more deserving of God's love than another. At camp this is also taught when there are minor quarrels amongst the camper's. 
#### Friday's letter:
