#### From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

We begin the new church year by counting. Advent is a season of four weeks and we mark each of them very clearly with special lights. As the days in the natural season get progressively darker, our Advent season gets brighter each week until all four candles are burning and we celebrate the birth of the One who is the Light of the world.

But Advent is not just the time when we prepare for the birthday of the Savior; it is also the time when we prepare for and look forward to Christ's return in glory at the end of time. The church calls it the second coming, the Parousia. Only later this month will we get to Christmas. And so we begin Advent with an emphasis on the "End."

As Christians we begin the new church year by looking to the future, to the end of time as we know it. While the world thinks we are celebrating a past, as Christ's followers we know that just as Jesus came to us once, so He will come again... and the next time, He will come with power and glory.

And so it makes sense that a vision of the future such as this shapes how we live today. Luke tells us that signs are not definitive, time is marked by a different standard. What is clear is how we are to BE and what we are to DO in the midst of worldly uncertainties: lives that are marked by a focus on Jesus, the One who brings love not hostility,

community not separation, sharing not selfishness, peace not fear.

Perhaps this year, when you send out Christmas cards to friends and family, you might consider sharing not only the good but something that reflects the struggles of the year, the darkness that is real in our world and in our lives. Yet in all of this we are certain that the darkness surrounding us is not the end of the story, for there is the hope of God breaking forth into the darkness of our world and our lives:

"Joy to the world, the Lord is come!"

May our Advent and Christmas season bring us closer to God and one another.






#### Anti-Racism Taskforce



#### Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurse

Dear Congregation,

Let's talk about Prostate Cancer. The most common cancer among men (after skin cancer) is prostate cancer. Being proactive by knowing risks, prevention and early detection can mean a longer life and better outcome for the men we love. Let's start with an overview about prostate cancer. The numbers are not great. There are about 164,690 cases of this disease this year. This breaks down to one man in nine will be diagnosed positive for prostate cancer. There are approximately 29,430 deaths due to this disease per year. This is about one man in 41 will die due to prostate cancer. Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of death in American men. It is a serious disease, but most men diagnosed with prostate cancer do not die. In fact 29 million men in the United States are still living after their diagnosis.

#### Causes

The cause of prostate cancer is truly not known exactly. Research has found some risk factors and studies are revealing how prostate cells become cancerous. Some gene mutation is just hereditary, about 5 to 10 percent of men get prostate cancer due to familial genes. Some research has found that men with high levels of a hormone named Insulin lite Growth Factor-1 are more likely to develop the disease. Some studies have found that inflammation in the prostate may contribute to Prostate cancer. When reading about causes of Prostate cancer I found the study that exposure to radiation or cancerous chemicals can cause a DNA change to the prostate cells, but actually there isn't any proof this is a cause to mutations of the prostate cells.

#### Detection

Early detection with a simple blood test of a PSA level is recommended. Men with a PSA level 2.5 or above should have a blood test

yearly. Discuss with your care provider about screening. The American Cancer society suggests, men age 50 years and with average risk should be screened. Men age 45 and have a family history of a father, brother or son with diagnosis should be screened. Men age 40 and have a family member diagnosed at an early age should also be screened. I cannot stress the importance of early detection.

#### Treatment

Treatment for Prostate cancer goes along with a discussion of options and side effects of treatments. Treatments range from surgery, radiation therapy, cryotherapy, and hormone therapy trying to prevent the cancer from spreading to bones. One may feel rushing to treat is highly important but time to absorb the diagnosis mentally and emotionally is also of importance. For more information about Prostate Cancer go to the American Cancer society website at www.cancer.org/prostate cancer.

There is the sad fact that people are uncomfortable speaking openly about Prostate cancer. A reluctance that can have such a devastating consequence. Making a change with social awareness helps people understand that they are not alone when facing challenges in their journey with prostate cancer. Raising awareness is a powerful tool to fight against this disease. Educating men and their loved ones, making them aware of the support structures available and just losing the stigma behind speaking out about this disease will help save future lives. So all the men out there is it time for a PSA test?? Do yourself a favor and ask your provider.

## Music Notes From the Director of Music

#### Joy to the World: a Christmas Carol?

Joy to the World is one of the most well-known songs of the Christmas season, yet it is not really about Christmas at all. Written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), it is a song about the second coming of Christ rather than the first.

Isaac Watts was born in South Hampton, England. The son of a dissenting pastor, he exhibited a gift for rhyme early on and wrote his first hymn at age fifteen. Isaac went on to become a pastor and served a large independent church in London. He also continued to be a prolific hymn writer, writing some 750 hymns during his lifetime. In 1719 he published a hymn book titled The Psalms of David: Imitated in the Language of the New Testament and Applied to the Christian State and Worship. In this collection, he rewrote the Psalms to reveal their New Testament meaning and included specific references to Christ and his ministry. It is in this collection that we find the rewriting of Psalm 98 that we know as the hymn Joy to the World.


Often, the first line of the hymn is mistakenly sung: "Joy to the world! The Lord has come." What Watts wrote was actually: "The Lord is come!" Like Psalm 98, Watts is referring to the second coming of Christ, not the first. This is evident in phrases like "...the Savior reigns" and "He rules the world with truth and grace."

Antioch, the tune to which Joy to the World is sung, was created by an unknown individual who pieced together musical themes from the oratorio Messiah, by George Frederick Handel (1685-1759). Such borrowing of musical ideas was common in those days and there is no autographed score by Handel indicating that he composed the actual tune itself. American music educator Lowell Mason (1792-1872), who had considerable influence in his day, published Joy to the World in 1836 in the U.S. and gave the tune Antioch its name.






- Scissors
