#### From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

Love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself. Luke 10:27

Years ago, when I was a camp counselor on a travel staff team in Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas, I remember meeting a woman who was into clowning ministry.

I found it interesting how she described clowning as a very prayerful activity, and that when she put on her white face she would no longer speak, even though she loved to give her opinion on everything. It was her way of reflecting what clowning folks speak of when they say that "downing of the clown whiteface and costumes is accompanied by prayer in which, following Scripture, the clowns-to-be 'die' to themselves and their own desires and concerns and take on a 'new identity' which is the clown that each is becoming in the mirror." It is to be a serious commitment. And she said it was not an easy task for her to keep quiet for long periods of time.

When I heard of the book "White Flour" by David LaMotte, I thought of my friend at camp. And it struck me how there really are many different creative responses to bigotry and hatred. Here is one that is in the book "White Flour" inspired by true events in May of 2007 in Knoxville, Tennessee when the Ku Klux Klan held a rally in that city. Protestors came, but not the usual protestors. These protestors were dressed in colorful clown costumes, and they were smiling. The KKK, who were wearing their white costumes, were confused, they came to make people angry, but these people were smiling and happy. The KKK raised their fists and shouted, "White Power!" The clowns all looked at one another in wonder. They huddled together until one said, "I've got it! White flour!" And they found in their costumes little packages of white flour, and poured them all over one another, all over the street, and danced in glee. The people in their white cloaks got more angry, and shouted louder, "White Power!" The clown protestors listened even more intently, they one said: "I've got it now!" "White flowers! Screamed the happy clown, and all the rest joined in!" And they threw lovely white flowers on themselves and on others.

"You could almost see the marchers turning red beneath white cloaks. They wanted to look scary! They wanted to look tough! One rushed right at the clowns in rage and was hauled away in cuffs." But they shouted all the more and as clearly as possible. "White Power."

One more time, the clowns looked at one another embarrassed by how they misunderstood the words and another clown shouted I've got it and shouted. "Wife Power!" and happily celebrated all the women in the group. The KKK guit their march and left, in frustration, but without any violent confrontations.







It is that time of year again. Happy New Year to you all! I came across an article written by Jeff Hayward called "Focused on Self Care, 6 New Year's resolutions." The article brings reality of self-care to a basic level. Maybe the article will bring your personal thoughts of resolutions back to the simple things in life.

We often lose focus of ourselves in our busy lives, which can lead to a negative impact on our mental and physical health. There is always something that is needed to be done for someone else. Well this year turn the spotlight back onto you. If you are still searching for a New Year's resolution, start by looking inward. What is it you really need to improve on. Which will then

translate across all areas of your life as well as your relationships with others. Here are six self-care promises for 2019.

#### One: Be Kinder to yourself.

The idea of setting weight loss goals is that you are implying you have failed and need to improve. While getting a bit of exercise and eating better can ultimately improve how you feel you shouldn't choose a resolution as a punishment for yourself. Ask yourself "Am I doing this for myself or for others?" Determine if your goals are for your own satisfaction and not to meet the standards of others.

#### Two: Embrace Sankalpa.

Sankalpa is rooted in the practice of yoga. It is aimed to guide us towards things that will make you happy, without changing your core self. The idea of Sankalpa is to believe you are already good enough to fulfill your dreams. Pretty positive way of thinking.

#### Three: Stop more often.

In 2019 try to stop more often. Put away the electronic devices. Move your less important meetings and find somewhere beautiful, a park, woods, kitchen and just sit. Take time for stillness regularly. This is a time for reflection and peace.

### Four: Learn to appreciate your reflection.

We often focus on things we dislike about ourselves. We end up missing the features we should love. The idea that you are going to love everything about your appearance is unattainable. So why struggle with it? Take action for what you can do and forget about temporary setbacks. Have self-love.


