From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

Illustrator, teacher, speaker and author of the book "To Dance with God" Gertrud Mueller Nelson shared the following story: Some years ago, I spent an afternoon caught up in a piece of sewing I was doing. The wastebasket near my sewing machine was filled with scraps of fabric cut away from my project. This basket of discards was a fascination to my daughter Annika, who, at the time, was not yet four years old. She rooted through the scraps searching out the long bright strips, collected them to herself, and went off. When I took a moment to check on her. I tracked her whereabouts to the back garden where I found her sitting in the grass with a long pole. She was affixing the scraps to the top of the pole with great sticky wads of tape. "I'm making a banner for a procession," she said. "I need a procession so that God will come down and dance with us." With that she lifted her banner to flutter in the wind and slowly she began to dance. This allowed me to witness a holy moment and I learned all over again how strong and real is that sense of wonder that children have – how innate and easy their way with the sacred. And, of course, I had to wonder what happens in our development that as adults we became serious folk, uneasy in our relationship with God, out of touch with the mysteries we knew in childhood, searching to regain a sense of awe and a way to 'dance with God.'

In Psalm 149:3 the psalmist writes: "Let us praise God's name with dancing, making melody to God with tambourine and lyre!"

May we be aware that God is indeed leading us in the dance through life. Worship is a time where - through gestures and movements, through spoken and sung responses, through gathering, reading, and eating - we are strengthened by the Holy Spirit to dance with God in response to all that God has done for us in Jesus Christ, the Lord of the dance of life.

When Martin Luther wrote in the Small Catechism that through baptism we are raised daily to newness of life, I believe he caught on to the idea of being raised daily to dance God's ever renewing dance of life.

In the song "Lord of the Dance," the refrain puts it this way: "Dance, then wherever you may be. I am the Lord of the dance said he and I'll lead you all wherever you may be, and I'll lead you all in the dance said he."

Let's intentionally have a skip in our step in the months to come so that all may know that the Lord of the Dance is leading us.

From our Re-opening Committee

(No changes from our July Newsletter. Next committee meeting is August 9)

Dear Members of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church,

On behalf of the Church Council, the Re-Opening Committee has an update for the plan for opening Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. With safety and your cooperation foremost in reinstating services and activities in the church, please read and understand your role in the process.

This is an update to the interim plan for this church building and property. This committee remains vigilant in keeping staff and members of the church safe. In the process of re-opening, a variety of service options are available, allowing for personal choices for attending. Masks, even if attendee is vaccinated, are required to be worn properly during in building worship services. Leaders of the service may lower or remove mask during speaking or singing. The organist, based on distancing may remove mask while seated and playing.

Sunday Drive-In Church- 9am (July 18) Outdoor, weather permitting Sunday Worship- 9am June 20 - Sept 5th Sept 12th resume 8:30am and 10:30am services

Indoor seating is every other pew and social distancing is still encouraged and masks are required. Persons of the same household may be seated together.

Keeping our commitment to grow ministry, the indoor 9am Sunday service of Good Shepherd can be viewed on your computer or electronic device online at gslacrosse.org. Archived church services of Good Shepherd can also be found on the church's website!

Groups and Committees may meet in the building, but meeting outside or through Zoom is the safest. The Mattes Center will be used for all meetings held indoors. If a group or committee wants to meet in person, contact the Church Office. The Chairperson or Leader of the Group or Committee will need to provide the date/time of the meeting to the Church Office to allow adequate time for set-up and sanitizing.

Large community groups who use the church for meeting space will need to contact the Church Office and adhere to the Interim Plan. This committee will meet again August 9, 2021 to review the current COVID conditions, the Interim Plans, and church use to further update its recommendations.

The success of the re-opening plan is dependent on the cooperation of all when coming together to hear the word of God and celebrate our faith. We have a church that has remained strong through a pandemic because of each of you. Thank you.







Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

World lung cancer day is August first. Lung cancer is a type of cancer that begins in the lungs. Lungs function to take in oxygen when you inhale and release carbon dioxide when you exhale. According to the Mayo Clinic, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer deaths worldwide.

Those who smoke have the greatest risk of lung cancer, but lung cancer can occur in anyone. Lung cancer typically doesn't cause signs and symptoms in its earliest stages. Signs and symptoms usually occur when the disease is advanced and include: A new cough that doesn't go away, coughing up blood, shortness of breath, chest pain, hoarseness, and headache. Risk factors for lung cancer include smoking, exposure to secondhand smoke, previous radiation therapy, exposure to radon gas, exposure to asbestos, and a family history of lung cancer.

People with an increased risk of lung cancer may consider annual lung screening using low-dose CT scans. Screenings is offered to older adults who have smoked heavily for many years or who have quit in the past 15 years. If diagnosed with lung cancer, there are many treatment options: surgery, to remove the entire lung or an affected portion, radiation therapy, chemotherapy, and targeted drug therapy.

If you or a loved one smoke, the best thing you can do for yourself is to quit. Smoking is an addiction and the brain is hooked on nicotine. Without it, you'll go through withdrawal. Line up support in advance and ask your doctor about all the methods that will help.

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives. Good Shepherd has a great history of sending kids to the ELCA Youth Gathering and are excited for a new group to experience this event. Students going into 9th-12th grade during the 2022-2023 school year are eligible to participate. The Gathering will be June 24-28, 2022 in Minneapolis, MN. The theme for this Gathering is "Boundless: God beyond Measure." Speaking both as a former participant and as a mom of a participant, I can honestly tell you the Youth Gathering is a faith-changing experience. To be surrounded by so many other teens, from all over the country, who want to serve God through fellowship and service is pretty amazing. Music Notes From The Director of Music

Hymn Focus: Just As I Am

Just as I am, without one plea, But that Thy blood was shed for me, And that Thou bidst me come to Thee, O Lamb of God, I come, I come.

"Just As I Am", the signature hymn of the Billy Graham crusades, was written by English poet, hymn writer, and editor Charlotte Elliott (1789-1871). Elliott was born in Brighton, England to Charles and Eling Elliott. Her maternal grandfather, the Reverent Henry Venn, was an evangelical preacher and her parents belonged to the evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. She was well educated and developed a passion for music and art early in life. She also became a portrait artist and a wellknown writer of humorous verse.

At an early age, Elliott developed an awareness of her own sinful nature and felt unable to face God. She came to live a secular life until, at age 32, she was inflicted with a severe and debilitating illness that left her feeling the need for a personal Savior. Around this time, the Reverend Cesar Malan was visiting her father's residence and asked her if she was at peace with God. She resented the question, but a few days later told him she wanted to cleanse her life before becoming a Christian. Malan told her, "Come just as you are" and she became a Christian that day. Her health improved the following year, but in 1829 she relapsed and suffered severe debilitation for the rest of her life.

In 1834 Elliott's brother, the Reverend Henry Venn Elliott, was starting St. Mary's Hall, a charity school for the daughters of poor clergy. One day, while her whole family was helping at a church bazaar to raise funds for the school, Charlotte lay at home feeling lonely, useless and depressed. Recalling the words of Reverend Malan, "Come just as you are", she overcame her feelings and penned the very successful poem "Just As I Am" to help raise money for St. Mary's Hall.

What you do:

Players line up behind the Leader, who moves around in various ways. Followers must copy the Leader's movements faithfully. Try these variations:
