From Pastor John Stennes-Spidahl

It is the second week of November as I write and just about the first cold weather of the season has arrived. There have been occasional flurries of snow in the air and the trees are now mostly bare. Winter is coming. Christmas is coming too! While Easter, with its promise of resurrection, is arguably the most important celebration in the Christian Church my favorite holiday is Christmas. As a child the Christmas presents were a big part of the holiday for me. But there were so many other aspects of the holiday that appealed. The food, the lights, the wonderful carols, the family traditions all made this time of year so special for me. On Christmas Eve our family would head out to visit several homes – good friends and also older people of limited means. My Dad would make little care packages with sweet soup, flatbread, foot long hot dogs, and Christmas cookies that we would bring to each home. Then we would sing "Jeg Er Så Glad Hver Julekveld" ("I Am So Glad Each Christmas Eve") and "Silent Night" and be on our way to the next stop. Then it was time for church. After the Christmas Eve service at Augustana Lutheran Church we headed home for the traditional meal: sweet soup with lefse and flatbread, lutefisk, potatoes, and spareribs. We would enjoy some cookies and candy and after cleaning up it would be time to open gifts. But first someone, often me because I was the oldest, would read the Christmas story from Luke, chapter two. We understood from an early age that real reason for the season was the mystery of the Word made flesh.

When I was young our family had a very traditional nativity set that was the focus of our Christmas décor. Naomi and I were married in October,1984. That November we visited her family in Minneapolis for Thanksgiving. I took the opportunity to go the retail store that Augsburg Fortress maintained in downtown Minneapolis and found a beautiful Italian nativity set much like the one we had growing up. That became the first of many nativities as we developed pattern of acquiring new ones every year. We have nativities from many different countries: Indonesia, Ethiopia, Cameroon, Mexico, Iceland, Peru, Bolivia. Germany, and others.

From our Re-opening Committee

Dear Members of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church,,

On behalf of the Church Council, the Re-Opening Committee has an update for the plan for opening Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. With safety and your cooperation foremost in reinstating services and activities in the church, please read and understand your role in the process.

This is an update to the interim plan for this church building and property, approved by the Church Council on November 16, 2021. At this meeting the Church Council approved additional measures of reinstating a variety of service options and former practices that were suspended due to COVID. Masks remain required in the church building regardless of vaccination status. Masks are to be worn properly, covering the nose and mouth upon entering, and while in the building and during worship service(s). Leaders of the service may lower or remove mask during speaking or singing. The organist, based on distancing, may unmask while seated and playing.

Sunday Worship- **8:30 and 10:30am starting December 5th** through May 2022 when service times change to 8:30 and 10:00am for summer.

Social distancing is still encouraged, as well as the use of hand sanitizer that is provided within the church and pews. During worship services, the congregation and choirs may sing but must remain masked. The adult and bell choirs are able to resume practicing and performing within church services at the discretion of their directors.

Sunday School remains open and available for children of Good Shepherd. Masks are required for children attending Sunday School. The nursery is available for feeding or changing purposes only.

Keeping our commitment to grow ministry, the 8:30am Sunday service of Good Shepherd can be viewed on your computer or electronic device online at gslacrosse.org. Archived church services of Good Shepherd can also be found on the church's website!

Church Groups and Committees may meet in the Mattes Center. A laptop computer is available for use to include members who wish to connect through Zoom. If a group or committee wants to meet in person, contact the Church Office. The Chairperson or Leader of the Group or Committee will need to provide the date/times of the meeting to the Church Office to allow adequate time for set-up and sanitizing.

Large community groups may use the Mattes Center Only for a meeting space. They will need to contact the church office with the date, times, and expected number of attendees.

Members are asked to report a positive COVID test result for anyone who was in attendance at a Good Shepherd Worship Service, Sunday School or Confirmation within 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms.

This committee will meet again on December 20, 2021 to review the current COVID conditions, the Interim Plans, and church use to further update its recommendations. The success of the re-opening plan is dependent on the cooperation of all when coming together to hear the Word of God and celebrate our faith. We have a church that has remained strong through a pandemic because of each of you. Thank you.

Remember that many of the people that our meal drivers deliver to may see no one else but you that day, so please give them a big HI and a smile from you and Good Shepherd!!






Our COVID protocols remain in effect so as we worship together, we ask that for the health and safety of all, please remember:







Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

This month's article will touch on colorectal cancer. Colorectal cancer or cancer of the colon or rectum is the third leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the U.S. Early detection is vital, as treatment is successful with 85 percent of colon cancer patients living at least five years. Colon cancer occurs when cells in the body begin changing and multiplying at fast rates. The colon is the last part of the digestive tract and plays a large role in absorbing water and storing food waste.

Screening for colon cancer is recommended at age 50 for both men and women. For those at average risk for colon cancer, a colonoscopy is the recommended form of screening and should take place every 10 years. Risk factors such as family or personal history may increase the frequency one should be receiving a colonoscopy. Colonoscopy not only detects cancer but can identify pre-cancerous growths know as polyps. These polyps are removed before they turn into cancer.

Patients with colon cancer may notice symptoms right away. By the time symptoms appear, the cancer may have grown or spread to other organs. Symptoms can include: a change in bowel habits such as diarrhea, constipation, or a feeling your bowel is not empty after a bowel movement, bright red or dark blood in your stool, constant tiredness, stools that are thinner than normal, unexplained weight loss and vomiting.

Screening can save your life. If you have any of these symptoms, are 50 or older, or have a family history of colon cancer you should be screened. Consult with your primary care provider if you believe you need to be screened.

Music Notes From The Director of Music

Joy to the World: a Christmas Carol?

Joy to the World is one of the most well-known songs of the Christmas season, yet it is not really about Christmas at all. Written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), it is a song about the second coming of Christ rather than the first

Isaac Watts was born in South Hampton, England. The son of a dissenting pastor, he exhibited a gift for rhyme early on and wrote his first hymn at age fifteen. Isaac went on to become a pastor and served a large independent church in London. He also continued to be a prolific hymn writer, writing some 750 hymns during his lifetime. In 1719 he published a hymn book titled The Psalms of David: Imitated in the Language of the New Testament and Applied to the Christian State and Worship. In this collection, he rewrote the Psalms to reveal their New Testament meaning and included specific references to Christ and his ministry. It is in this collection that we find the rewriting of Psalm 98 that we know as the hymn Joy to the World.

Often, the first line of the hymn is mistakenly sung: "Joy to the world! The Lord has come." What Watts wrote was actually: "The Lord is come!" Like Psalm 98, Watts is referring to the second coming of Christ, not the first. This is evident in phrases like "...the Savior reigns" and "He rules the world with truth and grace."

Antioch, the tune to which Joy to the World is sung, was created by an unknown individual who pieced together musical

themes from the oratorio Messiah, by George Frederick Handel (1685-1759). Such borrowing of musical ideas was common in those days and there is no autographed score by Handel indicating that he composed the actual tune itself. American music educator Lowell Mason (1792-1872), who had considerable influence in his day, published Joy to the World in 1836 in the U.S. and gave the tune Antioch its name.

For me this drives home the truth that the Nativity of our Lord is celebrated in many different cultures. When I was a parish pastor in Cashton, we started a tradition of welcoming the confirmation students into our home shortly before Christmas. After they had completed their memory work in the connected office, they were invited into the dining room for Christmas cookies and hot chocolate. Then I would challenge them to see how many nativity scenes they could find in our house. The last year we did this several people found twentyseven. We have added a few more since then. I have heard that the idea of creating a nativity scene came from Francis of Assisi. He believed it was a simple way to teach people who didn't know how to read the story of Christmas.


