From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

"May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds."

The paschal candle is a symbol of the hope that is ours in Jesus Christ, who, risen from the tomb, brings the light of God's presence into our own lives and through the Holy Spirit dispels the darkness that can surround us. As Jesus says in John 8:12, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

The paschal candle burns throughout the Great Fifty Days of the Easter season, for it is a sign of our hope in God's love rooted in the resurrection of Jesus; our hope of resurrection to life everlasting and of resurrection to new and renewed life lived each day in the promises of baptism.

At baptisms, the paschal candle burns as a sign of hope, hope that is ours when we are washed in those waters of God's gracious love. It is a sign of hope in the promise of God's light, the light of life, accompanying us throughout our lives and dispelling the darkness that surrounds us.... dispelling the darkness that surround Ukraine and other places of conflict around the world. The paschal candle lights up the dark valleys of illness or personal trails through which each of us sometimes walks. The darkness is dispelled by the light of life – the light of Christ's presence shining within us and through us. The paschal candle burns

brightly beside the font when a new sister or brother in Christ is sealed with the Holy Spirit in the waters of baptism, and is a sign of hope in the life God has in store for us.

At funerals, the paschal candle burns as a sign of hope that is ours having been joined to Jesus in a resurrection like his – a hope that accompanies us throughout our lives and which does indeed dispel the darkness of death that continually surrounds us. By reminding us of the hope that is ours for a resurrection to life everlasting, the paschal candle burns brightly beside the casket as that blessed eternal life is begun.

When you see the paschal candle burning these fifty days or, after that, at a baptism or at a funeral, I pray you will call to mind the hope in God's love it symbolizes. Hope that the light of Christ – the light of life, rising in glory, will indeed dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds in life and in death. And may that remembrance come as a blessing to you this Easter season and beyond. For we light the paschal candle because Christ is risen, Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

From our Re-opening Committee

Reflects changes from our committee meeting on March 14

On behalf of the Church Council, the Re-Opening Committee has an update for Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and reinstating activities of the church, please read to understand your role in the process. This is an update to the interim plan for this church building and property as of March 15, 2022. The Church Council has approved the following measures of reinstating a variety of former practices that were suspended due to COVID.

- Masks are optional in the church building.
- The Welcome Area is open along with the kitchenette coat rack, and coffee station.
- Pews will remain as every other available for seating.
- Social distancing, or sitting with members of your household is still encouraged.
- Continue to use hand sanitizer throughout the church building.
- The Adult, Gloria Dei and Bell Choirs to resume practicing and performing.
- Sunday School is available for children attending Good Shepherd on Sundays.
- The Nursery is available for families. Please wipe down anything used or that may have gone into a little one's mouth.
- Food, beverages, pot lucks, meals, events are able to be planned again. Please communicate use of the kitchen with the Church Office.

Keeping our commitment to grow ministry, the Sunday service of Good Shepherd will remain at 8:30 and 10:30am until the switch to summer hours on June 5th then the service times are 8:30 and 10am. The 8:30am service can be viewed on your computer or electronic device online at <u>gslacrosse.org</u>. Archived services can also be found on that website.

Community Groups, Church Groups and Committees may meet and a laptop computer is available for members who wish to participate through Zoom. Please communicate your meeting date and time with the Church Office.

Members are asked to report a positive COVID test result for anyone who attended Good Shepherd Worship Services, Sunday School or Confirmation, or Committee or Group meeting within 48 hours after the onset of symptoms.

This committee has changed its name to the **Communal Health Committee** as a result of the Church moving back to Phase 1 of its COVID Plan and has reinstated its former practices. This committee will continue to monitor for any significant changes in our community health and advise the church accordingly. This Committee will meet again May 16, 2022.

THANK YOU for your prayers, patience, and cooperation as we came together to hear the word of God and celebrate our faith. We have a church that has remained strong through a pandemic because of each of you. Thanks be to God.



Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

As things (hopefully) begin to blossom and green up, we thought we would focus this month's article on vision, but specifically, cataracts. Cataracts are the clouding of the lens of your eye, which is normally clear. For your eye to provide you with vision, light needs to pass through a clear lens. The lens is behind your iris (which is the colored part of your eye). The lens focuses the light so that your brain and eye can work to process information into a picture. When a cataract clouds over the lens, your eye can't focus light in the same manner. This leads to blurry vision.

Cataracts are caused by the breakdown of protein in the lens over time. As proteins break down, they linger and make your lens cloudy. Some things can speed up the formation of cataracts such as: diabetes, steroids, radiation, and spending a lot of time in the sun without eye protection.

Cataracts are a common part of the eyes aging process. Eventually, they can cause: Vision that's cloudy, blurry, foggy, or filmy. Sensitivity to bright sunlight, lamps, or headlights. Glare (seeing a halo around lights), especially when you drive at night with oncoming headlights. Prescription changes in glasses, including sudden near sidedness. Double vision. Need for brighter light to read. Difficulty seeing at night. Changes in the way you see color.

Cataracts are diagnoses when an eye doctor dilates your pupil to see inside your eye. Your



Health Questions? Gundersen Telephone Nurse Advisor 24/7 at (800) 858-1050. doctor can see if you have cataracts or other problems and find out how much of your vision is blocked. If your cataract symptoms are mild, you might just need a new prescription for glasses. Eventually, your doctor will likely recommend surgery to remove the cataract. During this procedure your doctor makes a small opening in the eye to reach the clouded lens. Using ultrasound or a laser, your doctor breaks the lens into pieces. The doctor suctions lens fragments from your eye and puts in a new plastic lens.



On May 1st, we will be celebrating the Affirmation of Baptism with this year's 8th graders. Otherwise known as

"Confirmation", the Affirmation of Baptism is the culmination of years spent in Sunday school and Confirmation classes learning about God, Jesus, and the many people and stories that have been shared in an attempt to understand God's love. Starting in 6th grade, our teens start this deeper exploration into their faith. The ultimate goal is to see their faith grow over the three years of the program. The students discuss how the stories in the Bible can teach us things in our everyday life, how the lessons of God's love goes WAY back, can still be seen today, and will continue in the future, and discuss questions about faith and religion. Students are required to do community service, work to connect different sermons to their lives and the gospel, and complete different projects depicting what faith looks like in their world. Their families create faith squares with loving messages and favorite Bible verses for the confirmands to be reminded of all the love surrounding them. This year, these squares where beautifully quilted into a wall hanging by the talented Good Shepherd quilters. Finally, the students sit down and have a meeting with me and Pastor to reflect on their faith journey. These individual meetings are intended to for them to tell us how their faith has grown, but in the end, those discussions ultimately make my own faith grow. Our confirmands are incredible kids...full of questions, ideas, thoughtfulness, questions, love and so much faith. Hymn Focus: "Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore"

"Pescador de Hombres" ("Fisher of Men"), the original title of "Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore", was written by Spanish composer Monseñor Cesáreo Gabaráin (1936-1991). Gabaráin was one of the most prominent composers of Post-Vatican II Spanish liturgical music.


Beginning his musical studies at age 10 at the minor seminary in Zaragoza, he went on to study at Seminario Mayor of San Sebastián and was ordained to the priesthood at San Sebastián on Dec. 19. 1959. He then served as chaplain of the College of the Marist Brothers of Antzuola in Gipúzkoa, as chaplain at Fundación Zorroaga, a nursing home in San Sebastián and as chaplain in the College of the Marist Brothers in Madrid. He served in parish ministry in Nuestra Señora de las Nieves (Our Lady of the Snows) and was head of religious education in the College of San Fernando. He died of cancer in Antzuola in 1991, after touring 22 U.S. cities to conduct workshops in conjunction with OCP (Oregon Catholic Press).

"Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore" was written in 1979 and is based on the Gospel passages where Jesus calls his first disciples: "As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 'Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' At once

Gabaráin conveys the disciples' obedience and commitment to Jesus, leaving their fishing boats behind to follow him, and calls us to follow our Lord in the same way. The melody "Pescador de Hombres" brings this scripture passage even closer to heart with a gentle rocking movement that is reminiscent of a boat by the lakeshore. This hymn has been published in 11 hymnals and has been translated into as many as 80 languages.
