Tucked away in the corner of the church campus behind the kitchen is a small little room that is bustling with activity, and there are no plans to slow down throughout the summer either. It is the quilting room with a wonderful group of quilters, women and men, young and old, members and non-members. When my daughter Berit met her husband Nolan a number of years ago when they were both in college, they got on the topic of sewing with a group of others. They asked each other if anyone knew how to sew. Nolan said he did, and with surprise they asked where he learned to sew. And his answer was: from the quilters of my church. Nolan wasn't from Good Shepherd but I know that the quilters here at Good Shepherd would be more than willing to help teach anyone wanting to help with the quilting how to cut, piece together, sew, and tie. The point is, you don't have to be a professional quilter to participate, all you need is a willingness to learn and get involved.

To have a place for a group of quilters fits so well in the ministry of the Church, because to me quilts remind me of the Church. Each little piece of fabric is not enough, in and of itself, to create a quilt. Although some pieces might be more attractive to the eye than others, no one piece is more useful than another. When all the pieces are put together they form something greater than the individual parts and are a work of art.

all equally important. We are incomplete without those around us participating and letting their beauty shine as well. Together we are the patchwork of the body of Christ. It is in sewing us together into one community that we make God visible to world

From our Re-opening Committee

Reflects changes from our committee meeting on May16

On behalf of the Church Council, the Re-Opening Committee has an update for Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and reinstating activities of the church, please read to understand your role in the process. This is an update to the interim plan for this church building and property as of March 15, 2022. The Church Council has approved the following measures of reinstating a variety of former practices that were suspended due to COVID.

- Masks are encouragedl in the church building.
- The Welcome Area is open along with the kitchenette coat rack, and coffee station.
- Pews will remain as every other available for seating.
- Social distancing, or sitting with members of your household is still
- Continue to use hand sanitizer throughout the church building.
- The Adult, Gloria Dei and Bell Choirs to resume practicing and
- Sunday School is available for children attending Good Shepherd on Sundays.
- The Nursery is available for families. Please wipe down anything used or that may have gone into a little one's mouth.
- Food, beverages, pot lucks, meals, events are able to be planned again. Please communicate use of the kitchen with the Church Office.

Keeping our commitment to grow ministry, the Sunday service of Good Shepherd will remain at 8:30 and 10:30am until the switch to summer hours on June 5th, then the service times are 8:30 and 10am. The 8:30am service can be viewed on your computer or electronic device online at gslacrosse.org. Archived services can also be found on that website.

Community Groups, Church Groups and Committees may meet and a laptop computer is available for members who wish to participate through Zoom. Please communicate your meeting date and time with the Church Office.

Members are asked to report a positive COVID test result for anyone who attended Good Shepherd Worship Services, Sunday School or Confirmation, or Committee or Group meeting within 48 hours after the onset of

This committee has changed its name to the Communal Health Committee as a result of the Church moving back to Phase 1 of its COVID Plan and has reinstated its former practices. This committee will continue to monitor for any significant changes in our community health and advise the church accordingly. This Committee will meet again May 16, 2022.

Thank you to Ann Hudson who sends out meaningful cards and handmade prayer shawls to bereaved families throughout the year.







Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

We decided to focus this month's article on the observance of National Stroke Awareness Month. Each year in the US there are more than 800,000 strokes. Stoke is a leading cause of death in the country and causes more serious long-term disabilities than any other disease. Roughly three-quarters of all strokes occur in people over the age of 65.


Stroke is a disease that affects the arteries leading to and within the brain. A stoke occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain is either blocked by a clot or bursts. When that happens, part of the brain cannot get the blood it needs, so it and brain cells die. An easy way to remember what happens during a stoke is to think of F.A.S.T. F stands for face, ask the person to smile, does one side of the face droop? A stands for arm weakness, ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? S stands for speech, ask the person to repeat a simple phrase, is his or her speech slurred or strange? T stands for time to call 911 (time is brain). If you or someone you know experiences any of these symptoms, and you suspect they may be having a stroke, call 911 as soon as possible.

The major risk factors for stroke include high blood pressure, diabetes, high LDL cholesterol levels, smoking, and infections or conditions that cause inflammation, such as lupus or rheumatoid arthritis. Early treatment with medications, or an emergency endovascular procedure can drastically improve someone's recovery from a stroke. Exercising regularly,

eating a diet rich in fruits and vegetables, managing diabetes, quitting tobacco use, and lowering the amount of cholesterol, and saturated fat in your diet are some of the best ways to help prevent a stroke.



Hvmn Focus: Blest Be the Tie That Binds

Blest be the tie that binds Our hearts in Christian love; the unity of heart and mind is like to that above.

Born in Yorkshire, England John Fawcett (1739-1817) was orphaned at the age of 12. He was largely self-educated and served as a tailor's apprentice to survive. At the age of 16 he was exposed to the preaching of George Whitfield and became a Christian. He first joined the Methodist Church and three years later became active in the Baptist Church in Bradford, where he was often asked to preach.

At the age of 25, the newly married Fawcett was invited to serve as pastor at the small Baptist Church in Wainsgate, Yorkshire and was ordained as minister there. The small town of Wainsgate was populated by people who were mostly farmers and shepherds, poor and uneducated. Since the people could pay Fawcett little in salary, they would help by bringing John and his wife, Mary, wool, potatoes and other produce. As Mary began having children, they found it very difficult to make ends meet. The Fawcett's, nonetheless, embraced the poor people of Wainsgate and grew the congregation by engaging families house to house, developing a strong bond with the townspeople.

In 1772 Fawcett accepted an invitation to serve as pastor at Carter's Lane Baptist Church in London. Carter's Lane was a large church offering a much higher salary, which would relieve John and Mary's struggling financial situation. They packed

up their household belongings and prepared to move. John preached his last sermon at Wainsgate and concluded with the hymn he wrote for this occasion, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds". However, after seeing the people's outpouring of love and tears, Mary later told John that she didn't think she could leave these people whom they had learned to love and John allowed that he shared her sentiment, so they unpacked the wagon and John served as pastor there for the rest of his life.

SANDY SCENES


Make a scene with this fun summer craft you can create outdoors.



- Play sand
- Spoons • Empty jars
- Powdered tempera paint
- Cardstock paper and pencil
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush -

What you do:

- 1. Pour a few tablespoons of sand into empty jars. (You need one jar for every color of paint you make.)
- 2. Add a small amount of powdered paint to the sand and then mix. Experiment with the amount, using more paint to create deeper colors.
- 3. Lightly sketch a design on cardstock.
- 4. Working in one small section at a time, paint an even layer of craft glue on the paper.
- 5. Use a spoon to sprinkle colored sand atop the glue. Tilt the paper so extra sand falls off. Repeat to complete the entire design.
- 6. Let dry on a flat surface before displaying upright.
