From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

Michael Lindvall, in a collection of stories entitled, "The Good News From North Haven", has this Christmas Program happening which is both humorous and meaningful.

He writes that it was supposed to be a typical Christmas pageant with two Sunday School children serving as Mary and Joseph.

"This year's Mary, whose name was actually Mary, was taking her role with an intense and pious seriousness. She looked into the face of the doll in her arms with eyes that really seemed to see the infant Christ. Joseph was another story. He had gotten the part because he had been rejected from Christmas Pageant participation by Alvina Johnson (the former director) more times than any other kid in church. 'with good reason', some might say."

"Anyway, Mary and Joseph were to walk on as the narrator read, 'And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of David, which was called Bethlehem... to be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child.' At least this is what the narrator was supposed to read. It was what the narrator had read at the rehearsal. But a few hours before the performance, one of the young mothers had observed that none of the children could understand much King James English, so they voted to switch to the Good News translation of the Bible for the performance. 'What kid knows what "great with child" means?" they asked."

"The Good News translation is much more direct at this point. So, as Mary and Joseph entered, the narrator read, 'Joseph went to register with Mary who was promised in marriage to him. She was pregnant.'

As that last word echoed from the narrator through the PA system into the full church, our little Joseph, hearing it, froze in his tracks, gave Mary an incredulous look, peered out at the congregation, and said, "Pregnant? What do you mean, pregnant?' This, of course, brought down the house. My wife, wiping tears from her eyes, leaned over to me and said, 'You know, that may well be just what Joseph actually said."'

We hardly think about the scandal of the birth of Jesus. In the Gospel of Matthew, we're told that Joseph was shocked when he found out that Mary was pregnant. He decided to end his engagement with her, but he would do so privately in order not to put even more shame on Mary. It took the intervention of an angel to save their relationship.

From that scandal, that birth, we have received Jesus who has saved us and gives us life both now and eternally. At this time of year, we can only marvel that God works in such a way for the sake of the world. For not only is his birth a scandal but the Apostle Paul points out that so is his death. God certainly doesn't worry about such scandals, not as long as the Divine will is served, which is to bring love and saving grace to all the world.

We are doing 8 weeks for Mobile Meals throughout the 2022 calendar year and we will be looking for you to help with delivering meals in 2022!


Remember that many of the people that our meal drivers deliver to may see no one else but you that day, so please give them a big HI and a smile from you and Good Shepherd!!







Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

This months article focuses on the thyroid and conditions associated with it. The thyroid is a butterfly-shaped gland that sits low on the front of the neck. The thyroid is rich in blood vessels and nerves for voice quality pass through it. They thyroid secretes several hormones with the main hormone being thyroxine or T4. Thyroid hormones act throughout the body, influencing metabolism, growth and development, and body temperature. Two of the most common thyroid conditions and hyperthyroidism and hypothyroidism.


Hypothyroidism is a condition in which the thyroid gland doesn't produce enough of certain hormones. Hypothyroidism may be due to several factors, including autoimmune disease, thyroid surgery, radiation therapy, pregnancy, and medications (lithium). The signs and symptoms of hypothyroidism vary, depending on the severity of the hormone deficiency. Problems tend to develop slowly, often over several years. Signs and symptoms may include fatigue, increased sensitivity to cold, constipation, weight gain, hoarseness, thinning hair, and muscle weakness. This condition most often affects middle-aged and older women. See your doctor if you're feeling tired for no reason or have any of the other signs or symptoms of hypothyroidism.

Hyperthyroidism occurs when your thyroid gland produces too much of the hormone thyroxine or T4. Hyperthyroidism can be caused by several conditions including graves'

disease, plummers disease, and thyroiditis. Hyperthyroidism can mimic other health problems, which can make it difficult for your doctor to diagnose. Symptoms can include unintentional weight loss, rapid heartbeat or irregular heartbeat, increased appetite, anxiety and irritability, tremor, and increased sensitivity to heat. Some of the most serious complications of hyperthyroidism involve the heart, so it is important to completely describe the changes you've observed to your doctor.

November was a busy month for our Confirmation kids. They helped out with God's Work, Our Hands, and helped set up the Holiday Marketplace. We also spent some more time diving into some of the books of the New Testament, specifically Thessalonians and Corinthians. The kids are starting to understand that these epistles or letters were written for people in different regions as the church was starting to grow.

We discussed how the letters to the Thessalonians can be applied to us so many years later. We know from the letters that Jesus will come again but we don't know when or where. This means we have to stay diligent in treating each other the way God has told us and the way Jesus showed us.

We also talked a lot of love. The letters to the Corinthians specifically tells us that we have to love one another, even when we disagree. We talked about different kinds of love and how we can spread love, even when it is difficult to do so.

In honor of Thanksgiving, the students selected three people to write thank you notes for being important parts of their lives. I know I am very grateful for Pastor's wisdom and ability to answer the hard questions our teens ask. I am also very grateful for our small group guides who show up with a positive attitude and make the

discussions so much more meaningful. Lastly, I am grateful for all the kids. They are an amazing, diverse group, with lots of ideas, questions, and comedic relief. Their willingness to participate and explore some important topics is bucket-filling experience.

The Confirmation students will be heading over to English Lutheran in early December to experience the living Bethlehem. This event is an amazing opportunity to immerse yourselves into the Christmas experience. I would recommend checking it out.

As December rolls around, I pray that we all keep the meaning of Christmas in our views. It is easy to lose sight of what we are celebrating with all the hustle and bustle that the holiday season brings. Making time to appreciate the gift of Jesus' birth is a great way to grow in your own faith and keep the craziness of the season in perspective.

Music Notes From The Director of Music

Joy to the World: a Christmas Carol?

Joy to the World is one of the most well known songs of the Christmas season, yet it is really not about Christmas at all. Written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), it is a song about the second coming of Christ rather than the first.

Isaac Watts was born in South Hampton, England. The son of a dissenting pastor, he exhibited a gift for rhyme early on and wrote his first hymn at age fifteen. Isaac went on to become a pastor and served a large independent church in London. He also continued to be a prolific hymn writer, writing some 750 hymns during his lifetime. In 1719 he published a hymn book titled The Psalms of David: Imitated in the Language of the New Testament and Applied to the Christian State and Worship. In this collection, he rewrote the Psalms to reveal their New Testament meaning and included specific references to Christ and his ministry. It is in this collection that we find the rewriting of Psalm 98 that we know as the hymn Joy to the World.

Often, the first line of the hymn is mistakenly sung: "Joy to the world! The Lord has come." What Watts actually wrote was: "The Lord is come!" Like Psalm 98, Watts is referring to the second coming of Christ, not the first. This is evident in phrases like "...the Savior reigns" and "He rules the world with truth and grace."

Antioch, the tune to which Joy to the World is sung, was created by an unknown

individual who pieced together musical themes from the oratorio Messiah, by George Frederick Handel (1685-1759). Such borrowing of musical ideas was common in those days and there is no autographed score by Handel indicating that he actually composed the tune itself. American music educator Lowell Mason (1792-1872), who had considerable influence in his day, published Joy to the World in 1836 in the U.S. and gave the tune Antioch its name.
