From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

We are once again in the season of Lent, a "wilderness" time to reflect on our lives in relationship with God and with one another as we walk with Jesus to Jerusalem and the cross. It is the season for searching our souls, for reading and listening to the Scriptures, and for proclaiming God's Word and how our lives of faith intersect with the message God speaks to us. We are blessed this year, as we begin again the Wednesday evening Lenten Holden Evening Prayer liturgy, with reflections being shared from members of Good Shepherd. Judy Casto, Austin Stalsberg, Randy Page, Joan Schultz and Steve Stelzl will be sharing their personal journeys and how God and the church have made a difference in their lives.

The worship services with Holden Evening Prayer will begin at 6:30pm and go through the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday begins our Lenten journey. It is my hope that each one who listens to these very personal accounts may be touched in a way that inspires her or him to a new and deeper life with Christ. At the end of this Lenten season, Easter comes again as the climax of God's revelation to us. It is God's proclamation of hope through the victory of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The Easter message promises us hope for a future on the other side of death.

Along with adding a Lenten discipline of including a Wednesday worship, I would also like to encourage each of you to take time to learn more about our companion synods. You can find information about them at lacrosseareasynod.org. Put your cursor over the "Ministries" tab and move down to "Companion Synod – Czech Republic" or "Companion Synod – Peru."

Companion synod relationships of the ELCA connect Lutheran churches throughout the world with ELCA synods and congregations. These relationships are concrete expressions of communion and fellowship with the more than 140 Lutheran member churches of the Lutheran World Federation. During this Lenten season, I encourage you to look into these relationships based on "accompaniment" which has its roots in the values of mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, empowerment and sustainability. All these are important values that all healthy relationships are built on. Over the years, groups of people from our Synod have visited and been visited by the Lutheran Church of the Czech-Republic and the Iglesia Luterana del Perú (the Lutheran Church of Peru). If you have interest in being part of a team visiting these Companion Synods or simply want to learn more about them, let someone at the Synod office know so they keep you informed about these possibilities. I hope listening to members from our Church and learning about our Companion Synod congregations may be a blessing to you on your Lenten journey.

Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses


March is colorectal cancer awareness month. Colorectal cancer or cancer of the colon or rectum is the third leading cause of cancerrelated deaths in the U.S. Early detection is vital, as treatment is successful with 85 percent of colon cancer patients living at least five years. Colon cancer occurs when cells in the body being changing and multiplying at fast rates. The colon in the last part of the digestive tract and plays a large role in absorbing water and storing food waste.

Screening for colon cancer is recommended at age 50 for both men and women. For those at average risk for colon cancer, a colonoscopy is the recommended form of screening and should take place every 10 years. Risk factors such as family or personal history may need a colonoscopy earlier or more frequently. Colonoscopy not only detects cancer but can identify pre-cancerous growths knows as polyps. These polyps are removed before they turn into cancer.

Patients with colon cancer may notice symptoms right away. By the time symptoms appear, the cancer may have grown or spread to other organs. Symptoms can include: a change in bowel habits such as diarrhea, constipation, or a feeling your bowel is not empty after a bowel movement, bright red or dark blood in your stool, constant tiredness, stools that are thinner than normal, unexplained weight loss and vomiting. Screening can save your life. If you have any of these symptoms, are 50 or older, or have a family history of colon cancer you should be screened. Consult with your primary care provider if you believe you need to be screened.

Hymn Focus:


Just As I Am

Just as I am, without one plea, But that Thy blood was shed for me, And that Thou bidst me come to Thee, O Lamb of God, I come, I come.

"Just As I Am", the signature hymn of the Billy Graham crusades, was written by English poet, hymn writer, and editor Charlotte Elliott (1789-1871). Elliott was born in Brighton, England to Charles and Eling Elliott. Her maternal grandfather, the Reverent Henry Venn, was an evangelical preacher and her parents belonged to the evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. She was well educated and developed a passion for music and art early in life. She also became a portrait artist and a wellknown writer of humorous verse.

At an early age, Elliott developed an awareness of her own sinful nature and felt unable to face God. She came to live a secular life until, at age 32, she was inflicted with a severe and debilitating illness that left her feeling the need for a personal Savior. Around this time, the Reverend Cesar Malan was visiting her father's residence and asked her if she was at peace with God. She resented the question, but a few days later told him she wanted to cleanse her life before becoming a Christian. Malan told her, "Come just as you are" and she became a Christian that day. Her health improved the following



In 1834 Elliott's brother, the Reverend Henry Venn Elliott, was starting St. Mary's Hall, a charity school for the daughters of poor clergy. One day, while her whole family was helping at a church bazaar to raise funds for the school, Charlotte lay at home feeling lonely, useless and depressed. Recalling the words of Reverend Malan, "Come just as you are", she overcame her feelings and penned the very successful poem "Just As I Am" to help raise money for St. Mary's Hall.








- 1 package unflavored gelatin
- ³/₄ cup very warm water
- 1 tsp salt
- ³/₄ cup gel body wash
- Food coloring
- Rubbing alcohol in spray bottle
- Silicone baking molds

What you do:

- 1. In a bowl, stir gelatin and warm water until dissolved.
- 2. Add salt, body wash and a few drops of food coloring. Stir.
- 3. Spray molds with rubbing alcohol (to prevent bubbles). Place molds on a tray.
- 4. Pour mixture into the molds. Refrigerate until set, about two hours.
- 5. Pop soap out of molds and store in an airtight container.
