From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

At the last council meeting, a couple of the council members mentioned that several of our members approached them wondering when we will celebrate communion again the way we used to. I can understand that concern, and I am glad that it was brought up, since there is a certain experience connected with the walking up to the altar and receiving the elements there. As it looks right now, we will probably not go back to intinction receiving the bread and dipping it into the wine - but we are looking into giving out individual cups on a tray with prefilled non-alcoholic wine with the host (bread). The reason this has not happened vet is because we are in need of ushers to help make this happen at both services. In addition to that, we would also need to have more members getting involved with the altar guild. The altar guild takes care of filling the cups before the communion services, setting up the communion table at both services, and making sure they are taken away again after each service.

So you see that there is some work behind the scenes that requires sustained commitment. Like everywhere else, the pandemic has had the side-effect of causing a disruption in the life of our congregation and some of the empty spots need to be filled with new people. I would love to see more members participate as ushers and in the altar guild, but until that happens we will continue with communion the way we have been doing it during the last couple of years. Please think about helping out

in one of those functions and let someone in the office know if you are interested!

During the first three weeks of May we continue with the 50 days of Easter celebration. When life gets hard, when I have yet another graveside or funeral service or a time of remembering someone's life, I am grateful that death is not the last word. I am grateful that Jesus was born, that he lived for a time on this earth and that he died for us, but the next part is key: that Christ rose again from the dead. The women who came to the tomb attest that the tomb was empty. At that time in history, if you were going to make up a story, you would not tell it with women being the first ones to announce that the tomb Jesus was placed in was empty, and that they were the first ones Jesus appeared to after he was raised from the dead. But this is how the story is recorded in our Bible, because the witnesses simply told what they experienced.

There is more historical information about Jesus' life, death and resurrection than any other figure in history. And though there have been and will be plenty of critics of Jesus and the church, I am grateful to be part of a church that celebrates Jesus' life, death, and resurrection and strives to live out his command to love one another as Christ has loved us.

Christ is risen, Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Please allow 1 1/2 to 2 hours for deliveries. We are route #1.



Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

With summer fast approaching, we thought we would focus this month's article on ultraviolet (UV) safety. According to the CDC, UV radiation is a form of non-ionizing radiation that is emitted by the sun and artificial sources such as tanning beds. While it has benefits for humans, including the creation of vitamin d, it also can cause health risks.

Beneficial effects of UV radiation include the production of vitamin D, a vitamin essential to human health. Vitamin D helps the body absorb calcium and phosphorus from food and assists bone development. The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends 5 to 15 minutes of sun exposure 2 to 3 times a week.

Although beneficial, the sun emits UV radiation and too much can cause issues. Sunburn is a sign of short-term overexposure, while premature aging and skin cancer are side effects of prolonged UV exposure. Some oral and topical medicines, such as antibiotics, birth control pills, and benzoyl peroxide products, as well as some cosmetics, may increase skin and eve sensitivity to UV in all skin types. UV exposure increases the risk of potentially blinding eye diseases if eye protection is not used. Overexposure to UV radiation can lead to serious health issues, including cancer. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States. The two most common types of skin cancer are basal cell cancer and squamous cell cancer. Typically, they form on the head, face, neck, hands, and arms because these body parts are the most exposed to UV

radiation. Most cases of melanoma, the deadliest kind of skin cancer, are caused by exposure to UV radiation.

To protect yourself from UV radiation: Stay in the shade, especially during midday hours. Wear clothes that cover your arms and legs. Wear a wide brim hat to shade your face, head, ears, and neck. Wear wraparound sunglasses that block both UVA and UVB rays. Use sunscreen with sun protection factor (SPF) 15 or higher, for both UVA and UVB protection. Avoid indoor tanning. Indoor tanning is particularly dangerous for younger users; people who begin indoor tanning during adolescence or early adulthood have a higher risk of developing melanoma.



Youth Update Confirmation (Grades 6-8) High School Youth (Grades 9-12)

"Keep alert, stand firm in your faith, be courageous, be strong. Let all that you do be done in love." 1 Corinthian 16:13-14

On April 30th, we will be celebrating the Affirmation of Baptism with this year's 8th graders. Otherwise known as

"Confirmation", the Affirmation of Baptism is the culmination of years spent in Sunday school and Confirmation classes learning about God, Jesus, and the many people and stories that have been shared in an attempt to understand God's love. Starting in 6th grade, our teens start this deeper exploration into their faith. The ultimate goal is to see their faith grow over the three years of the program. The students discuss how the stories in the Bible can teach us things in our everyday life, how the lessons of God's love goes WAY back, can still be seen today, and will continue in the future, and discuss questions about faith and religion. Students are required to do community service, work to connect different sermons to their lives and the gospel, and complete different projects depicting what faith looks like in their world. Their families create faith squares with loving messages and favorite Bible verses for the confirmands to be reminded of all the love surrounding them. This year, these squares where beautifully quilted into a wall hanging by the talented Perlie Bagstad, Jennifer Klar, and Cathy Villand. Finally, the students sit down and have a meeting with me and Pastor to reflect on their faith journey. These individual meetings are intended to for them to tell us how their faith has grown, but in the end, those discussions ultimately make my own faith grow. Music Notes From The Director of Music

Hymn Focus: Mothering God, You Gave Me Birth

Important for diversity in our worship music tradition are the hymns celebrating the feminine aspects and images of God, in contrast with the masculine. Perhaps no hymn in our Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal better illustrates this than #735, "Mothering God, You Gave Me Birth". Although often associated with more modern themes such as feminism and inclusivity, the inspiration for this hymn text actually comes from the writings of 14th century mystic, Julian of Norwich.

Living in medieval England, Julian lived a life of prayer and solitude at the Church of St. Julian (from which she took her name). Medieval England was a time and place of great violence, cruelty and pessimism, made worse by the Hundred Years War and the Black Death, In stark contrast to this reality and environment, Julian's writings were colorful and encouraging, reflecting her deep faith. According to scholar Austin Cooper, Julian was "a very intelligent woman...of great warmth and charm whose religious experience is expressed with vivid precision and gentle humanity".

In 1373, while deathly ill, Julian experienced a series of 16 profound visions, which were later published as her Showings. Seeing Christ as our "true mother", Julian said, "The human mother will suckle her child with her own milk, but our beloved mother, Jesus, feeds us with himself".

The poet Jean Janzen was asked to contribute some new hymn texts to the 1992 Hymnal: A Worship Book of the Mennonite Church, using writings of some of the English mystics for inspiration. She was impressed by the "rich language of these mystics and their startling ways of speaking...about God", as well as Julian referring to God her mother. Janzen's text, written in the first person, uses the metaphor of God as a nurturing mother and attributes different aspects of motherhood to each person of the Holy Trinity. Norwich, the tune for this hymn, was composed by Carolyn Jennings, Professor Emerita at St. Olaf College, composer and church musician.
