From Pastor John Stennes-Spidahl

Greetings,

As we cruise into August, I thought it might edifying to consider what to look forward to as we worship each Sunday. The Sundays in August include the Tenth through the Thirteenth Sundays after Pentecost. The Sundays after Pentecost comprise almost half of the church year, stretching from Trinity Sunday to Christ the King. Because the paraments on the altar and pulpit are green for every Sunday but one, it is often called "the long green season" (especially by preachers). Other seasons of the church year celebrate specific events – the time of waiting in Advent, the birth of our Lord, his manifestation as the Son of God in Epiphany, preparing for the great Paschal Feast during Lent, and the glorious resurrection – Easter. The long green season is a time of growth for Jesus followers.

The Scripture lessons during August focus on God's abundant provision for all our needs, such as the feeding of five thousand from Matthew 14 of the invitation in Isaiah 55 to come to God to see your deepest needs fulfilled. We will also hear the story of Jesus walking on water as his followers exclaim, "Truly you are the Son of God." Another theme for these weeks is God's love for the whole world. Jesus discovers great faith in a Canaanite woman and so reveals that his message is for all people. The prophet, Isaiah, proclaims:

"Thus says the LORD: Maintain justice, and do what is right, for soon my salvation will come, and my deliverance be revealed. And the foreigners who join themselves to the LORD, to minister to him, to love the name of the LORD, and to be his servants, all who keep the sabbath, and do not profane it, and hold fast my covenant – these I will bring to my holy mountain, and make them joyful in my house of prayer; their burnt offerings and their sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; for my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples. Thus says the LORD God, who gathers the outcasts of Israel, I will gather others to them besides those already gathered."

As we gather for worship on the Sundays in August, the followers of Jesus have many opportunities to grow in faith and love. We will hear again the good news that Jesus, the Messiah, God's Son has come to dwell with us. His presence calms our fears. He brings us assurance that God cares for us, and that God's love is for all people. I look forward to seeing you at worship.

Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

World lung cancer day is August 1st. Lung cancer is a type of cancer that can originate in lungs themselves, or can spread to the lungs from other parts of the body. Lungs function to take in oxygen when you inhale and release carbon dioxide when you exhale. According to the Mayo Clinic, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer deaths worldwide.

Those who smoke have the greatest risk of lung cancer, but lung cancer can occur in anyone. Lung cancer typically doesn't cause signs and symptoms in its earliest stages. Signs and symptoms usually occur when the disease is advanced and include: A new cough that doesn't go away, coughing up blood, shortness of breath, chest pain, hoarseness, and headache. Risk factors for lung cancer include smoking, exposure to secondhand smoke, previous radiation therapy, exposure to radon gas, exposure to asbestos, and a family history of lung cancer.


People with an increased risk of lung cancer may consider annual lung screening using low dose CT scans. Screenings is offered to older adults who have smoked heavily for many years or who have quit in the past 15 years. If diagnosed with lung cancer, there are many treatment options: surgery, to remove the entire lung or an affected portion, radiation therapy, chemotherapy, and targeted drug therapy.

If you or a loved one smoke, the best thing you can do for yourself is to quit. Smoking is

an addiction and the brain is hooked on nicotine. Without it, you'll go through withdrawal. Line up support in advance and ask your doctor about all the methods that will help.



Music Notes From The Director of Music

How Are Hymns Selected at Good Shepherd?

Perhaps you have wondered how hymns are selected at Good Shepherd Church and what goes into that process. As Music Director of Good Shepherd Church, it is my job to select most of the hymns that we sing for worship services. Pastor Harald or Pastor John can then make changes to the selected hymns if needed to make sure that they most closely match the sermon they will be preaching at a particular worship service.

In selecting the hymns, I rely on a worship planning resource called Sundays and Seasons, which assists worship leaders in all aspects of worship planning, including suggesting a variety of hymns for each worship service to choose from. According to ELCA guidelines, it is most important that the texts of the hymns match and support the readings and theme of any given worship service. In keeping with ELCA guidelines, I try to ensure that the hymns selected encompass the greatest possible variety and diversity of styles, both musically and textually.

The body of Christian hymnody represents the cultures of many peoples, both past and contemporary. Each culture had or has its own unique way of seeing and experiencing the word of God, and singing their hymns enable us to share in their experience. It is important to remember that all cultures, past and present, are part of the body of Christ.

When the recommended hymn choices include a hymn originating outside of America or Western Europe, a hymn in an African American style, a hymn which is in a popular contemporary style, or a hymn emphasizing the feminine aspects of God, I always select that hymn if it is practical to sing in the worship service. If a favorite hymn to many in the congregation is suggested (e.g., "I love to Tell the Story"), I always select that one for the worship service. It is truly a pleasure for me to play the hymns that I know the congregation loves!

- Black permanent marker


What you do:
