### From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

Friends in Christ,

It is hard to believe that summer is almost over, and I hope that everyone has had opportunities to enjoy the outdoors with family and friends.

In August, Vacation Bible School was a fun and educational experience for everyone who participated. With the new school year, we will again be starting a new year of Sunday School for our youngest members on Sunday mornings, confirmation class for 6<sup>th</sup>, 7th and 8th graders on Wednesday nights, and on the last Sunday of each month at 6:30pm, a Bible Study at church with a ZOOM option for those who can't attend in person.

For those who would like to be part of the musical ministry at Good Shepherd, there are opportunities to join the Church Choir, the children's Sunday School Choir, Sounds of Praise and the Bell Choir. In addition, there have been several young people that have expressed interest in a Youth Bell Choir. Please let me know if you are interested in being in the Youth Bell Choir this year. The Youth Bell Choir will meet each Sunday evening from 6:30pm to 7:30pm and will be conducted by Linda Jerome. Not only will you learn how to play the bells, but it is a great experience as you work together with others and build friendships.

Last month, we began once again celebrating communion by coming up to the altar. Intinction (dipping the bread into the wine) does not seem to be the best practice at this time; instead, we will be using the wafers as we have in the past with a gluten free option and will receive the wine in individual pre-filled stainless steel cups. Communion will continue to be on the first and third Sunday of each month. Hope to see you all in church! On September 3<sup>rd</sup> the new Lutheran Campus Pastor at LuMin will introduce himself at the beginning of worship at each service, and the Burrito Breakfast will also be available on that day. Rally Sunday will be on September 10th and be the official beginning of Sunday School. Along with the usual Rally Sunday festivities, it is planned to have a display of antique cars in the parking lot, possibly with an opportunity to ride in some of them after worship. Remember that on September 10th, the second service will return to the 10:30am time. On September 17th, Bishop Felix Malpica will be at Good Shepherd preaching and spending time after church to visit with us. Please come and show your support for our Bishop. Also that day at 4pm, we will be showing a wonderful movie that was in the theaters a few years back. This movie focuses on the Book of Esther in the Bible and is called "One Night with the King." Come and be moved by the visual story of Esther.

Remember that many of the people that our meal drivers deliver to may see no one else but the you that day, so please give them a big HI and a smile from you and Good Shepherd!!




### **2024 National Youth Gathering**



# Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

### Greetings,

September is national food safety education month. According to the FDA, there are about 48 million cases of foodborne illness annually – that's about 1 in 6 Americans each year. Each year, these illnesses result in an estimated 128,000 hospitalizations and 3,000 deaths. When you prepare meals and snack for yourself, your family, and your friend, it is important to follow food safety tips to help prevent foodborne illness. Learn the dos and don'ts of food-safe meal prep and start putting them into practice to protect you and your family.

The food supply in the United States is among the safest in the world. However, when certain disease-causing bacteria or pathogens contaminate food, they can cause foodborne illness, often called "food poisoning."

### **Know the Symptoms**

Consuming dangerous foodborne bacteria will usually cause illness within 1 to 3 days of eating the contaminated food. However, sickness can also occur within 20 minutes or up to 6 weeks later. Symptoms of foodborne illness can include vomiting, diarrhea, and abdominal pain – and flu-like symptoms, such as fever, headache, and body ache.

### **Handle Foods Safely**

Although most healthy people will recover from a foodborne illness within a short period of time, some can develop chronic, severe, or even life-threatening health problems. In addition, some people are at a higher risk for developing foodborne illness, including pregnant women, young children, older adults, and people with

weakened immune systems (such as transplant patients and individuals with HIV/AIDS, cancer, or diabetes). To keep your family safer from food poisoning, follow these four simple steps: clean, separate, cook, and chill.

### **CLEAN**

### Wash hands and surfaces often.

- Wash your hands with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds before and after handling food and after using the bathroom, changing diapers, and handling pets.
- Wash your cutting boards, dishes, utensils, and counter tops with hot soapy water after preparing each food item.
- Consider using paper towels to clean up kitchen surfaces. If you use cloth towels, launder them often in the hot cycle.
- Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables under running tap water, including those with skins and rinds that are not eaten. Scrub firm produce with a clean produce brush.
- With canned goods, remember to clean lids before opening.

### **SEPARATE**

### Separate raw meats from other foods

- Separate raw meat, poultry, seafood, and eggs from other foods in your grocery shopping cart, grocery bags, and refrigerator.
- Use one cutting board for fresh produce and a separate one for raw meat, poultry, and seafood.

# Music Notes From The Director of Music

### Fanny Crosby: Queen of Gospel Song Writers

Frances Jane Crosby (1820-1915) was born in Brewster, New York, Catching a cold at six weeks old, she developed inflammation of the eyes and was treated with mustard poultices to treat the discharges. Crosby believed this damaged her optic nerves and caused her lifelong blindness, but modern physicians believe it more likely that her blindness was congenital and simply not noticed at her very young age. When Crosby was eight months old her father died and she was raised by her mother and grandmother, who grounded her in the Christian faith and helped her remember long Bible passages.

In 1835 Crosby enrolled at the New York Institute for the Blind (NYIB), where she learned to play the piano, organ, harp and guitar, and became a good singer. Graduating in 1843, Crosby joined a lobbying group in Washington, D.C., which advocated in support of education for the blind. She was the first woman to speak before the United States Senate, where she read a poem. Becoming an instructor at the NYIB in 1846 she taught grammar, rhetoric and history until 1858, when she married fellow NYIB instructor Alexander van Alstyne (who was also blind).

Crosby wrote poetry, cantatas and popular, political and patriotic songs, but is best known for her hymns. Writing about 8,000 hymns, she is known as the Queen of

Gospel Song Writers and most American hymnals contain examples of her work, such as "Jesus, Keep Me Near the Cross" and "Blessed Assurance".

Crosby began composing a hymn by asking God for inspiration and composed six or seven hymns each day. She composed them entirely in her mind and worked on as many as twelve hymns at once before dictating them to an assistant (she could write little more than her name). The melodies to most of her hymns were written by others, such as principal musical collaborator Howard Doane. She was posthumously inducted into the Gospel Music Hall of Fame in 1975.

- Never place cooked food on a plate that previously held raw meat, poultry, seafood, or eggs unless the plate has been washed in hot, soapy water.
- Don't reuse marinades used on raw foods unless you bring them to a boil first.

#### COOK

### Cook to the right temperature

- Color and texture are unreliable indicators of safety. Using a food thermometer is the only way to ensure the safety of meat, poultry, seafood, and egg products for all cooking methods. These foods must be cooked to a safe minimum internal temperature to destroy any harmful bacteria.
- Cook eggs until the yolk and white are firm. Only use recipes in which eggs are cooked or heated thoroughly.
- When cooking in a microwave oven, cover food, stir, and rotate for even cooking. If there is no turntable, rotate the dish by hand once or twice during cooking. Always allow standing time, which completes the cooking, before checking the internal temperature with a food thermometer.


Bring sauces, soups and gravy to a boil when reheating.

### CHILL

### Refrigerate foods promptly

- Use an appliance thermometer to be sure the temperature is consistently 40° F or below and the freezer temperature is 0° F or below
- Refrigerate or freeze meat, poultry, eggs, seafood, and other perishables within 2 hours of cooking or purchasing. Refrigerate within 1 hour if the temperature outside is above 90° F.
- Never thaw food at room temperature, such as on the counter top. There are three safe ways to defrost food: in the refrigerator, in cold water, and in the microwave. Food thawed in cold water or in the microwave should be cooked immediately.
- Always marinate food in the refrigerator.
- Divide large amounts of leftovers into shallow containers for quicker cooling in the refrigerator.
