From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

Grace to You and Peace!

Throughout Advent, and as we have entered into the Christmas season, we have been singing the words of the angels, "Peace on earth, good will to all." Perhaps these words of the angels would be a good New Year's resolution."

An article I found on the website entitled (St. Peter of Damaskos, 12th century). "journeywithjesus.net" by Dan Clendenin about the early church monastics could be 5. Be extremely realistic: "Saint Anthony helpful to us and the world in living out the words of the angels. Each of the following could be a New Year's resolution in itself. Notice the year in which they were written.

- 1. Never stop starting over. "Every day is a new beginning". "My God, do not abandon me. I have done nothing good before Thee, but grant me, in Thy compassion the power to make a start." (Arsenios, 5th century)
- 2. Live intentionally, not aimlessly: "Think nothing and do nothing without purpose directed to God. For to journey without direction is wasted effort" (St. Mark the Ascetic, 5th century).
- 3. Pray simply, not stupidly: "Often when I have prayed I have asked for what I thought was good, and persisted in my petition, stupidly importuning the will of God, and not leaving it to Him to arrange things as He knows is best for me. But when I have obtained what I asked for, I have been very sorry that I did not ask for Pastor Harald the will of God to be done; because the

thing turned out not to be as I had thought (Evagrios the Solitary, 4th century).

- 4. Walk with humility: "St. John Chrysostom says that we do not know wholly even what is given in part, but know only a part of a part"
- said to Poemen, 'Expect trials and temptations until your last breath." "I am convinced that not even the apostles, although filled with the Holy Spirit, were therefore completely free from anxiety...Contrary to the ridiculous view expressed by some, the advent of grace does not mean the immediate deliverance from anxiety" (St. Makarios of Egypt, 5th century).
- 6. Always think good of everyone: "Show the greatest gentleness toward all people" (Evagrios the Solitary, 4th century).

Perhaps these words from some of the early church monastics will give us insight during the remainder of the Christmas season to live the words of the angels, "Peace on earth, good will to all" as we begin the year 2024.





Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

January is thyroid awareness month, so we decided to focus this month's article on such. The thyroid is a butterfly-shaped gland that sits low on the front of the neck. The thyroid is rich in blood vessels and nerves for voice quality pass through it. They thyroid secretes several hormones with the main hormone being thyroxine or T4. Thyroid hormones act throughout the body, influencing metabolism, growth and development, and body temperature. Two of the most common thyroid conditions and hyperthyroidism and hypothyroidism.


Hypothyroidism is a condition in which the thyroid gland doesn't produce enough of certain hormones. Hypothyroidism may be due to several factors, including autoimmune disease, thyroid surgery, radiation therapy, pregnancy, and medications (lithium). The signs and symptoms of hypothyroidism vary, depending on the severity of the hormone deficiency. Problems tend to develop slowly, often over several years. Signs and symptoms may include fatigue, increased sensitivity to cold, constipation, weight gain, hoarseness, thinning hair, and muscle weakness. This condition most often affects middle-aged and older women. See your doctor if you're feeling tired for no reason or have any of the other signs or symptoms of hypothyroidism.

Hyperthyroidism occurs when your thyroid gland produces too much of the

hormone thyroxine or T4. Hyperthyroidism can be caused by several conditions including graves' disease, plummers disease, and thyroiditis. Hyperthyroidism can mimic other health problems, which can make it difficult for your doctor to diagnose. Symptoms can include unintentional weight loss, rapid heartbeat or irregular heartbeat, increased appetite, anxiety and irritability, tremor, and increased sensitivity to heat. Some of the most serious complications of hyperthyroidism involve the heart, so it is important to completely describe the changes you've observed to your doctor.

Music Notes From The Director of Music

Hymn Focus: "Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore"

"Pescador de Hombres" ("Fisher of Men"), the original title of "Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore", was written by Spanish composer Monseñor Cesáreo Gabaráin (1936-1991). Gabaráin was one of the most prominent composers of Post-Vatican II Spanish liturgical music.

Beginning his musical studies at age 10 at the minor seminary in Zaragoza, he went on to study at Seminario Mayor of San Sebastián and was ordained to the priesthood at San Sebastián on Dec. 19. 1959. He then served as chaplain of the College of the Marist Brothers of Antzuola in Gipúzkoa, as chaplain at Fundación Zorroaga, a nursing home in San Sebastián and as chaplain in the College of the Marist Brothers in Madrid. He served in parish ministry in Nuestra Señora de las Nieves (Our Lady of the Snows) and was head of religious education in the College of San Fernando. He died of cancer in Antzuola in 1991, after touring 22 U.S. cities to conduct workshops in conjunction with OCP (Oregon Catholic Press).

"Lord. You Have Come to the Lakeshore" was written in 1979 and is based on the Gospel passages where Jesus calls his first disciples: "As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 'Come, follow me,' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' At once

they left their nets and followed him." (Matthew 4:18-20, NIV). Gabaráin conveys the disciples' obedience and

commitment to Jesus, leaving their fishing boats behind to follow him, and calls us to follow our Lord in the same way. The melody "Pescador de Hombres" brings this scripture passage even closer to heart

with a gentle rocking movement that is reminiscent of a boat by the lakeshore. This hymn has been published in 11 hymnals and has been translated into as many as 80 languages.

Geodes look plain on the outside but contain beautiful crystals. Create these "rocks" to show how God makes us new on the inside.

What you need:

- Clean cardboard egg carton
- Scissors (and adult help)
- Epsom salt
- Plastic zippered bags (one per color of dve)
- Food coloring
- Glue
- Paintbrush



What you do:

- 1. Cut out the tops and bottoms of all the egg compartments so you can make 6 ball shapes.
- 2. In each bag, put 3 tablespoons of Epsom salt and a drop or two of food coloring. Seal and shake to mix.
- 3. With the paintbrush, spread glue inside two egg-carton halves. Sprinkle a spoonful of Epsom salt into those halves. Then close and shake.
- 4. Open your homemade geode and shake out excess salt.
- 5. Optional: Preserve the crystals with a coat of clear-drying glue.
