From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

This year, the beginning of Lent is a full Karina Bronson eight days earlier than last year.

The 2024 Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th, which is also Valentine's Day. The service will begin at 6:30pm. Last year, we celebrated Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. Ash Wednesday is 40 days before Easter, not counting the Sundays. And Easter always falls on the first Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after March 21st. But if the first full moon happens on a Sunday, Easter is on the following Sunday. The earliest Easter can be is therefore March 22nd which last happened in 1818. The latest Easter can be is April 25th which happened in 1943 and will happen again in 2038, according to the United States Census Bureau.

As always, we will be using the Holden Evening Prayer written by Marty Haugen for the Wednesdays of Lent following Ash Wednesday. During those Wednesdays we will once again have speakers from Good Shepherd sharing what their faith and their connection to their church has meant to them in the joys and struggles of life.





Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses


Colorectal cancer or cancer of the colon or rectum is the third leading cause of cancerrelated deaths in the U.S. Early detection is vital, as treatment is successful with 85 percent of colon cancer patients living at least five years. Colon cancer occurs when cells in the body being changing and multiplying at fast rates. The colon in the last part of the digestive tract and plays a large role in absorbing water and storing food waste

Screening for colon cancer is recommended at age 45 for both men and women. For those at average risk for colon cancer, a colonoscopy is the recommended form of screening and should take place every 10 years. Risk factors such as family or personal history may need a colonoscopy earlier or more frequently. Colonoscopy not only detects cancer but can identify pre-cancerous growths knows as polyps. These polyps are removed before they turn into cancer.

Patients with colon cancer may notice symptoms right away. By the time symptoms appear, the cancer may have grown or spread to other organs. Symptoms can include: a change in bowel habits such as diarrhea, constipation, or a feeling your bowel is not empty after a bowel movement, bright red or dark blood in your stool, constant tiredness, stools that are thinner than normal, unexplained weight loss and vomiting. Screening can save your life. If you have any of these symptoms, are 45 or older, or have a family history of colon cancer you should be screened. Consult with your primary care provider if you believe you need to be screened.



Youth Update Confirmation (Grades 6-8) High School Youth (Grades 9-12)



Confirmation kids are continuing their study of the small Catechism. We finished our study of the 10 Commandments and the Apostle's Creed and are now looking at the Lord's Prayer. We are going through each line to discuss what it means. The 8th graders are also working on finishing their Confirmation requirements, which includes doing an interview with an adult about their faith, choosing a Bible verse that best represents their faith journey, and writing a reflection paper. In this month, dedicated to love, I hope we all take some time to think about what God tells us about the subject. which is a lot. I think the overall theme of the Bible is love...example after example of God's love for us, as well as his commandment to love one another. Last year we learned about when John addressed the Corinthians, and how that story reminds us that despite our differences, we are to love one another. He also talked about how our perceived "rights" are not greater than the commandment to love one another. I think all of us instinctively know we have a responsibility to care for one another and to look beyond the differences to find common ground. I hope our kids understand the role the Church plays in perpetuating the idea of loving everyone, even when it's hard. It seems fitting that Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day this year. If the season of Lent isn't a huge reminder of God's unconditional love, then I don't know what is! We will be ending our structured classes this month with the hope that students will continue to come on Wednesdays to the Lenten services. It has been a great year... We have some outstanding teenagers! I can't

thank our guides enough for their contribution to the Confirmation experience. Vicki, Jaclyn, Kim, Ren, and Stephanie are ROCK STARS!!!!! Our teens are so blessed to have them!

The National Youth Convention is this July. and we have 16 people going: 13 kids and 3 chaperones. The Youth Gathering bring together hundreds of kids from all over the country to participate in faith-based activities and service project. It will be an incredible event! Music Notes From The Director of Music

Hymn Focus: Just As I Am


Just as I am, without one plea, But that Thy blood was shed for me, And that Thou bidst me come to Thee, O Lamb of God, I come, I come.

"Just As I Am", the signature hymn of the Billy Graham crusades, was written by English poet, hymn writer, and editor Charlotte Elliott (1789-1871). Elliott was born in Brighton, England to Charles and Eling Elliott. Her maternal grandfather, the Reverent Henry Venn, was an evangelical preacher and her parents belonged to the evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. She was well educated and developed a passion for music and art early in life. She also became a portrait artist and a well -known writer of humorous verse.

At an early age, Elliott developed an awareness of her own sinful nature and felt unable to face God. She came to live a secular life until, at age 32, she was inflicted with a severe and debilitating illness that left her feeling the need for a personal Savior. Around this time, the Reverend Cesar Malan was visiting her father's residence and asked her if she was at peace with God. She resented the question, but a few days later told him she wanted to cleanse her life before becoming a Christian. Malan told her, "Come just as you are" and she became a Christian that day. Her health improved the following year, but in 1829 she relapsed and suffered severe debilitation for the rest of her life.


