#### From Pastor John Stennes-Spidahl

Greetings dear friends in Christ. I have been given the opportunity to report to you the results of the special congregational meeting which was held on April 7th. Many of you have already heard but this will make it public and official. The first item of business was to elect two council members to a second term. This decision was inadvertently missed at our annual meeting. I am happy to report that Karl Noll and Tim Knudsen were unanimously approved. They both do a lot to enhance the ministry of Good Shepherd and we are blessed that they are willing to continue to serve.

The other item on the agenda was to officially consider an idea that was raised at our annual meeting concerning our summer worship schedule. In our special meeting there was lively discussion about the pros and cons of moving to a single worship service during the summer months. It was encouraging for me to realize that most of the opinions voiced focused on how such a change would impact the mission and ministry of our congregation. It was thought that a single time in the summer might make it easier for new people to come and see what we are all about. This certainly makes sense to me. By far the most attractive suggestion was that having a single worship time would result in deepening our fellowship together. A member at the meeting said she normally attends the second service and that she is looking forward to seeing people who go

to the first service. When I announced the decision last Sunday our accompanist, Randy Lyden, came forward and told us how English Lutheran had switched to a single service several years ago and people were delighted at the results. The main reason they gave was precisely that outcome. They enjoyed the opportunity to get to know folks who usually worshipped at the other service.

The proposal to switch to a single service in the summer was approved by a solid majority of those present. It was then decided that the service would take place at 9:30am in the morning. We will try this new schedule this coming summer and see how it goes. So, starting the Sunday **after** Memorial Day we will gather at 9:30am. The service will be live-streamed. Then, on the Sunday **after** Labor Day we will resume our traditional service times of 8:30 and 10:30am. I look forward to seeing you at worship this summer.



We are seeking a new Coordinator of Confirmation and Youth Ministry.


This is an hourly position of up to 20 hours per week beginning in August. The hours are flexible and depend upon youth activities and include Wednesday night confirmation classes.





## Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

#### Greetings,

With spring in full bloom, we are focusing on exercise and the many positives it offers, including reducing your risk of heart disease and depression. Results from a new study show that physical activity's effects on stress — and related mood conditions — can protect against cardiovascular disease. The researchers found that there was an inverse relationship between physical activity and stress-related brain activity: higher levels of exercise resulted in lower levels of stressrelated brain activity. People with stressrelated brain conditions like depression saw a much larger benefit from physical activity. According to Dr. Ahmed Tawakol, MD, one of the researchers and a cardiologist in the Cardiovascular Imaging Research Center at Massachusetts General Hospital, exercise was "roughly twice as effective in lowering cardiovascular disease risk among those with depression."

Many medications for depression work by increasing neurotransmitters in the brain that can affect behavior and mood. Selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRIs) like Lexapro or Prozac are commonly prescribed for depression, and serotonin-norepinephrine reuptake inhibitors (SNRIs) like Cymbalta or Pristiq can be used to treat other anxiety-related disorders. But exercise can counter depression and stress-related brain activity in a number of ways, by affecting brain chemistry naturally: regulating appetite hormones, reducing inflammation, reducing stress, and increasing metabolism. Unlike

serotonergic antidepressants, physical activity increases activity in the prefrontal cortex, which improves mood. More activity in the prefrontal cortex in turn reduces stress-related overactivation of the autonomic nervous. Exercise also increases Brain Derived Neurotrophic Factor, which improves mood through alterations in brain plasticity.

Thirty minutes of exercise per day can make a huge difference in your health. With the many opportunities for exercise in the coulee region, you will never get bored or feel it is a chore. At the end of the day, it is your body and your health. Treat it as a temple!

On May 5th, we will be celebrating the Affirmation of Baptism with this year's 8th graders. Otherwise known as "Confirmation", the Affirmation of Baptism is the culmination of years spent in Sunday school and Confirmation classes learning about God, Jesus, and the many people and stories that have been shared in an attempt to understand God's love. Starting in 6th grade, our teens start this deeper exploration into their faith. The ultimate goal is to see their faith grow over the three years of the program. The students discuss how the stories in the Bible can teach us things in our everyday life, how the lessons of God's love goes WAY back, can still be seen today, and will continue in the future, and discuss questions about faith and religion. Students are required to do community service, work to connect different sermons to their lives and the gospel, and participate in different projects depicting what faith looks like in their world. Some families created faith squares with loving messages and favorite Bible verses for the confirmands to be reminded of all the love surrounding them. This year, these squares were beautifully quilted into a wall hanging by the talented Perlie Bagstad and Jennifer Klar. Finally, the students sit down and have a meeting with me and Pastor to reflect on their faith journey. These individual meetings are intended to for them to tell us how their faith has grown, but in the end, those discussions ultimately make my

own faith grow. Our confirmands are incredible kids...full of questions, ideas, thoughtfulness, questions, love and so much faith. In a world that seems claustrophobic with tragedy, these kids shine God's light into the world in a way that I know will pave the way for a better, more hopeful world. Their parents, grandparents, and villages have done an amazing job and Pastor and I are grateful we get to bask in their faith journeys for a short time. We couldn't have done it without the help of some amazing adults that served as Confirmation Guides this year. Vicki Sanwick, Kim Locknane, Jaclyn Osley, Stephanie Andersen, and Ren Weeks. The kids, Pastor, and I are so grateful to have these adults helping!

#### **Music Notes** From The Director of Music

#### Hymn Focus:

"Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us with Your Love"

The text for "Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us with Your Love" was written by Thomas Stevenson Colvin (1925-2000), a long-time missionary to Africa. Colvin was born and educated in Glasgow but spent most of his working life serving as a Church of Scotland missionary; first in Malawi and then in Tamale, Northern Ghana. He and his wife, Patricia, later returned to Malawi, staying there until he retired in 1990.

Colvin wrote the hymn "Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us with Your Love" in 1963, while attending a lay-training course on agriculture, development and evangelism in Chereponi, Northern Ghana. New converts to the faith brought him a folk tune which they felt would be appropriate for a song about Christian love. Colvin shared these thoughts about his writing of the text:

"Sitting there in the moonlight, I felt it simply had to be about black and white, rich and poor. I was ashamed of the wasteful affluence of my people, but proud of the Gospel that transforms us into servants of one another. It is only when we who are rich learn to have the humility of the slave toward the poor of the world that we shall be able to learn from them: they have so much to teach us and share with us."

The tune for this hymn, named Chereponi by Colvin after the village where he first heard it, was originally from a Ghanaian love song. Colvin believed all

Christians should worship in their native language and encouraged the African Christians, among whom he lived and served, to sing their praise to God with their own musical traditions.

The hymn as based on John 13, where Jesus washes the feet of the disciples. This Gospel text came to have special meaning for Colvin as he witnessed the people of Ghana living out the example of Jesus; doing for one another what Christ has done for them.


A flower frog sits atop a vase to help arrange flowers and hold stems in place. This personalized frog will become a favorite!

#### What you need:

- Air-dry clay
- Roller
- · Vase (or iar)
- Plastic knife
- Straw
- Acrylic paint and brushes

# What you do:

- 1. Roll out a portion of clay to about ½-inch thickness.
- 2. Cut out a circle that's slightly larger than the vase opening. (This will allow the finished frog to sit securely on top.)
- 3. To make holes for stems, use a straw to punch out circle shapes. If you make more than one frog, try arranging the holes in different patterns.
- 4. Let dry completely. Then personalize your work with acrylic paint.
- 5. When dry, place the frog atop the vase. Arrange flowers and greenery to make a Mother's Day bouquet.
