From Pastor Harald Bringsjord

Again it is December. As the church, the people of God, we live this month in the deep mystery of the Advent Season.

Advent, a word that comes from the Latin words advenire (to come to) and adventus (arrival), refers to Christ, our Savior, and it is a time marked by joyful expectation, hope, preparedness, and penance as we renew our focus on our Lord.

This season of expectant and joyful waiting is in stark contrast to any grabbing for power and prestige, it is in contrast to the cruelty and harm done by people in Jesus' time and throughout history. It is in contrast to the hatred and revenge and the frenetic nature of the world we live in.

While the world has us start the Christmas season immediately after Thanksgiving, as Christ's people we are called to observe Advent, to take time to focus on the centuries of waiting and preparation by God's chosen people which preceded the coming of the Messiah. This focus becomes clearer by our use of the tools of scripture and prayer, hymn singing and worship, kindness and forgiveness, self-reflection and mindfulness.

Even though Advent is the season preceding Christmas, its focus is by no means limited to just Christ's first coming. An equal theme in the Advent liturgy is the second coming of Christ, the anticipated return of the Lord, when he will come again to judge the world. In this Advent season we are encouraged

to wait, watch, and wonder and to keep our focus on God's message of love, joy, peace, kindness, and hope, and to ponder the holy mystery of the incarnation of Christ in human flesh. The Holy God comes and dwells with us, full of grace and truth. Emmanuel, "God-with-us," is the foundation of who we are as Christians and the basis of the church and our worship together.

For me there is something profoundly meaningful about gathering together with the people of God in worship every Sunday, and especially during the season of Advent, as we await and prepare our hearts for the celebration of the birth of Christ, as we share scripture and song, prayer and sacraments, and as we also await Christ's return in glory and power.

I pray that your celebration of the birth of Jesus as well as your Advent preparation will be a blessing for you and to all those around you. May God's peace be with you always - and in the words of Mary's Song of Praise - may our soul magnify the Lord and our spirit rejoice in God our Savior, this season and always.



Your Health From the desk of our Parish Nurses

Greetings,

This months article focuses on the thyroid and conditions associated with it. The thyroid is a butterfly-shaped gland that sits low on the front of the neck. The thyroid is rich in blood vessels and nerves for voice quality pass through it. They thyroid secretes several hormones with the main hormone being thyroxine or T4. Thyroid hormones act throughout the body. influencing metabolism, growth and development, and body temperature. Two of the most common thyroid conditions and hyperthyroidism and hypothyroidism.

Hypothyroidism is a condition in which the thyroid gland doesn't produce enough of certain hormones. Hypothyroidism may be due to several factors, including autoimmune disease, thyroid surgery, radiation therapy, pregnancy, and medications (lithium). The signs and symptoms of hypothyroidism vary, depending on the severity of the hormone deficiency. Problems tend to develop slowly, often over several years. Signs and symptoms may include fatigue, increased sensitivity to cold, constipation, weight gain, hoarseness, thinning hair, and muscle weakness. This condition most often affects middle-aged and older women. See your doctor if you're feeling tired for no reason or have any of the other signs or symptoms of hypothyroidism.

Hyperthyroidism occurs when your thyroid gland produces too much of the hormone thyroxine or T4. Hyperthyroidism can be caused by several conditions including graves'

disease, plummers disease, and thyroiditis. Hyperthyroidism can mimic other health problems, which can make it difficult for your doctor to diagnose. Symptoms can include unintentional weight loss, rapid heartbeat or irregular heartbeat, increased appetite, anxiety and irritability, tremor, and increased sensitivity to heat. Some of the most serious complications of hyperthyroidism involve the heart, so it is important to completely describe the changes you've observed to your doctor.

Music Notes From The Director of Music

Hymn Focus:

Joy to the World: a Christmas Carol?

Joy to the World is one of the most well-known songs of the Christmas season, yet it is really not about Christmas at all. Written by Isaac Watts (1674-1748), it is a song about the second coming of Christ rather than the first.

Isaac Watts was born in South Hampton, England. The son of a dissenting pastor, he exhibited a gift for rhyme early on and wrote his first hymn at age fifteen. Isaac went on to become a pastor and served a large independent church in London. He also continued to be a prolific hymn writer, writing some 750 hymns during his lifetime. In 1719 he published a hymn book titled The Psalms of David: Imitated in the Language of the New Testament and Applied to the Christian State and worship. In this collection, he rewrote the Psalms to reveal their New Testament meaning and included specific references to Christ and his ministry. It is in this collection that we find the rewriting of Psalm 98 that we know as the hymn Joy to the World.

Often, the first line of the hymn is mistakenly sung: "Joy to the world! The Lord has come." What Watts actually wrote was: "The Lord is come!" Like Psalm 98, Watts is referring to the second coming of Christ, not the first. This is evident in phrases like "...the Savior reigns" and "He rules the world with truth and grace."

Antioch, the tune to which Joy to the World is sung, was created by an unknown individual who pieced together musical themes from the oratorio Messiah, by George Frederick Handel (1685-1759). Such borrowing of musical ideas was common in those days and there is no autographed score by Handel indicating that he actually composed the tune itself. American music educator Lowell Mason (1792-1872), who had considerable influence in his day, published Joy to the World in 1836 in the U.S. and gave the tune Antioch its name.
